

GENERAL

The weather has been good to the Watauga Valley Mechanical Team and there have been a lot of good working days at the yard over the last several weeks. Looks like spring is knocking on our door and we can finally get some work done. YARD EXTENSION

Contracts have been signed with the contractors to start yard extension work on the Spring St. coach yard next month. The new addition to the yard will provide needed space to bring all our cars into the yard and not have to store them in other locations. New electrical service will also be installed during the work. Tracks 1 and 2 will be extended west 45 feet.

ROLLING STOCK

"Powhatan Arrow" coach (WATV 539): Had some air conditioning updates along with some HEP cable replacement. The car is on the 611 excursions through June.

"St Augustine" coach (WATV 500): Had new photos installed in car. All the seats were repaired with new parts installed. The car is on the 611 excursions through June.

"Moultrie" diner (WATV 400): Was used on the 611 trips out of Spencer to Lynchburg and Asheville on April 9 and 10th.

"Crescent Harbor" sleeper / lounge (WATV 2351): Had new upholstery installed on some of the lounge seats; wiring repairs in the electrical cabinet; and general overall cleaning in the car. #2351 was used on the 611 trips out of Spencer to Lynchburg and Asheville on April 9 and 10th.

"Clinchfield" business car (WATV 100): We are presently looking for trucks that will satisfy AMTRAK certification requirements.

JONESBOROUGH DEPOT and MUSEUM

Progress on the Chuckey Depot / Museum in Jonesborough is going great. Work on the building continues nearly every day and is projected to be completed by late May or early June of this year. Museum displays will not be up and running until later this year; however, the Chuckey Depot / Museum Committee is taking names now to help prepare displays for the museum. ROANOKE TRAIN STATION UPDATE

With the approval of a plan for a new train station in downtown by the Roanoke City Council. extension of Virginia AMTRAK service from Lynchburg to Roanoke is one step closer. The city will vacate a 985-foot area along Norfolk Avenue adjacent to the railroad and sell it to NORFOLK SOUTHERN for 10 dollars. Once the property is transferred to NORFOLK SOUTHERN, construction of a new boarding platform will commence. This was the last hurdle to be overcome in obtaining state approval for the service extension to Roanoke. The new platform will accommodate a nine-car AMTRAK train. The initiative to bring AMTRAK service to Roanoke began in 2014 and service is expected to begin sometime in 2017. The new service will open up the possibility of trips to Roanoke accompanied by visits to the Virginia Museum of Transportation and the O. Winston Link Museum. [WSLS Channel 10] News1

Locomotive Changes at Cass Scenic Railroad

[Trains Magazine Newswire, compiled by Kim Young] Look for a heavy-haul highway rig to move DURBIN & GREENBRIER VALLEY Climax No. 3 for a road trip some 20 miles south to the shops at the CASS SCENIC RAILROAD at Cass, WV, in April. A return trip will carry CSRR Heisler No. 6 to Durbin.

John Smith, president of the DURBIN & GREENBRIER VALLEY and operator of the CASS SCENIC RAILROAD, told *Trains News Wire* that "the goal is to get No. 3, a two-truck Climax, upgraded to FRA standards." He said the engine needs boiler work to meet the federal requirements. As for the CASS Heisler, shop forces are just completing FRA-mandated 1,472-day work.

"Rather than shut down the Durbin train while No. 3 is out of service, we decided to take No. 6 up there," Smith says. "By next Christmas, we hope to be able to run No. 3 back up there and bring No. 6 back to Cass on the old C&O line." The Greenbrier River overflowed its banks more than 20 years ago and damaged portions of the former CHESAPEAKE & OHIO Greenbrier Branch between Cass and Durbin. The DURBIN & GREENBRIER VALLEY eventually reopened about five miles south from Durbin, Smith says, and in 2015 about two miles of track north from Cass were rebuilt, including filling in one major washout. The first project this year will be lining and surfacing that track.

"We'll work upstream from Cass this summer. There's about nine miles to go including four good-sized washouts, and we'll put in 8,000 ties," Smith says.


