Spring Street Coach Yard Mechanical Report by Jim Magill

GENERAL

The Jonesborough Spring St. Coach Yard Extension is right on schedule. As of press time the project is 80% complete. The expansion was necessitated by the fact that the size of Watauga Valley's equipment collection exceeded capacity - we have more cars than track to put them on - so we're expanding. See picture of the expansion work in the Photo Section.

ROLLING STOCK

"Powhatan Arrow" coach (WATV 539): Car is up North in the Norfolk Southern Steam Program.

"St Augustine" coach (WATV 500): Car is up North in the Norfolk Southern Steam Program. Going on "The Capitol City Special" on July 7 to Washington, DC.

"Moultrie" diner (WATV 400): In service at the North Carolina Transportation Museum.

"Crescent Harbor" sleeper / lounge (WATV 2351): Going on "The Capitol City Special" on July 7 to Washington, DC.

"Clinchfield" business car (WATV 100): Presently in storage during the yard extension.

SOUTHERN caboose (X450): Is presently undergoing extensive restoration work with a new paint job exterior and interior. See photos of project in the Photo Section.

WE NS CUTS OUT TWO TRAINS ON THE BRISTOL LINE

Due to NORFOLK SOUTHERN's closing of the John Sevier Yard in Knoxville, two trains have been removed from the Bristol Line - 37Q and 38Q. Trains remaining are:

201 – Intermodal Train West
15T – Merchandise Train West
22A – Intermodal Train West
27V – Auto Train West
T23 – Greeneville Switcher (Greeneville to Bulls Gap) 202 – Intermodal Train East 16T – Merchandise Train East 23 G – Intermodal Train East 28K – Auto Train West T24 – Greeneville Switcher (Greeneville to Piney Flats)

Work Continues on the Restoration of ET Combine 15

Work continues on ET&WNC Combine #15, said to be the sole survivor of the country's finest narrow gauge passenger train set. The 98 year old combine is a triple combination car containing a Railway Post Office, a Baggage Compartment, and a Passenger Compartment

When complete, the restoration will return the car's appearance to its first twenty years of operation. Exterior siding will be replaced and the roof repaired .The vestibule end diaphragm and the buffers from both ends were removed after 1940 - The vestibule end diaphragm only will be restored. A stove and a bathroom were added to the baggage compartment during WWII. We have the stove. It is clearly not original but is from the early 1900's. We believe this section of the car was operated as a Jim Crow Car during World War II. The hole in the roof has been resealed. We will restore the baggage compartment to its pre-1940 condition

A sink was added to the stove bulkhead wall in the RPO compartment and piped to the water tank. The original sink in the toilet stall is there with no piping. These will be restored as is. The seats were replaced and the seating pattern changed early in the life of the car. The seat upholstery is Panasote, a material that is similar to naugahyde. The original seats came with rattan. The original seating pattern of 4 stationary seats and 2 walkover seats will be restored. The clerestory windows and screens have been covered over or sealed. These will be restored to as-built operating status. The green opal glass in the clerestory and above the triple windows will be restored. The glass in the oval bathroom window will be replaced with the original leaded green opal glass.

The interior colors will be the original orange shellac (light mahogany stain) for the woodwork and green ceiling in the passenger compartment and original yellow with white ceiling in the Baggage and RPO Compartments. The exterior colors over the years have been original (believed to be Pullman Green) burgundy, gray, Southern Green, red, light green (or gray), and green. We had a professional paint chip analyzer perform an analysis of a section of exterior siding. There was no evidence of any Pullman Green. Since this is clearly contradictory with pictures (color and Black & white) and original specifications, I believe the paint was stripped from the exterior at some point after 1950, probably at Tweetsie RR. We anticipate the restored exterior color will be the original Pullman Green with red window trim. The original color for the trucks is believed to be green.

The following areas will be restored to as-built if we can find the missing parts:

- 1. We seem to be missing both original stoves. We have one stove which is not original that is small enough to fit in the RPO spot. The passenger spot is bigger.
- 2. We do not have any of the oil lamps.

WE Trains on CSX Transportation through Erwin

There are three CSXT trains operating through Erwin, TN at present: Q696 (Kingsport, TN to Hamlet, NC); Q697 (Hamlet, NC to Kingsport, TN); AND F689 (Kingsport to Erwin, TN Local). There are no coal trains operating through Erwin.

WE NKP 765 Excursions Canceled on Account of Slow Ticket Sales



[Fort Wayne Railroad Historical Society Press Release] We've been in the railroad preservation industry since 1972. We have enjoyed over 44 years of success because we have committed ourselves to providing outstanding experiences for the general public and by treating the operation of the steam locomotive no. 765 like the business that it is.

In looking forward to our Galesburg Zephyr excursions on June 25^{th} and 26^{th} , we've had to weigh several important

factors. Operations like these can take months - if not years - of planning and logistical work. In addition to the planning, the cost of providing these excursions is significant. We announced these operations within 30 days of their planned execution, which is very unusual for us. Eager to take advantage of new opportunities for the 765 once the commitments from our partners were secured, we proceeded.

Ticket sales to date reflect meaningful interest, but subsequent sales have been less than satisfactory. This has lead us to conclude that while the trip has stimulated much interest, competing weekend plans and short lead time in the summer months have contributed to a selling rate far below our average.

While our operations historically have experienced a tremendous amount of successful, sellout trips, the lack of time to properly market and sell these tickets at the same time as our other recent operations in Chicago has left the Society with no choice but to make the difficult decision to postpone these trips. Based on the current sales data, we would need exactly 59 days to sell these trips out and time has run out.

The decision to postpone these trips in no way reflects the cooperation, interest or willingness of our various partners. It reflects wholly our desire to protect the financial future of our organization and the longevity of steam locomotive no. 765. It is incredibly rare for us to cancel any announced operation. We explored a variety of options and considered the multitude of outcomes that would face existing passengers before reaching this decision.

The Society, its management and countless volunteers have invested several months worth of time, effort and expenses into these excursions already. We sincerely apologize for any inconvenience that this may cause for our loyal fans, supporters, and of course passengers. Starting immediately, we'll be refunding passengers and offering all customers a 10% discount on a future excursion.

We are confident that with additional lead time and unique promotional opportunities that future planning can afford us, we will return to the Chicagoland area and thrill thousands more with the sights and sounds of the 765 and our historic train. We now have a 9 ft high wall and the track extension project is about to get done. The retaining wall contractors will finish up [June 21] and the railroad section men will be in Jonesborough Monday to start moving and laying track on the extension. Hopefully the NORFOLK SOUTHERN Track Foreman will be making his inspection [June 24] to put our 108-ton "Clinchfield 100" plus another 75-ton car

out on the extension. This has been a major project for Watauga Valley to make sure the 9 ft wall and fill will hold two railroad passengers cars. Jackson Jones Construction Company out of Tri Cities has done a great job in building the wall and having it tested to handle all this tonnage.

PARKING

Due to limited parking at the Woodfin Riverside Park, we are directing you to the top of the Craggy Mountain Line which is located at 111 North Woodfin Avenue, Asheville, NC. From this location, you will be transported down the Craggy Mountain Line to the park.

DIRECTIONS

On I-26 you will need to take Exit 24 which is the Elk Mountain Road exit.

From Asheville, take the exit ramp on the right, then right onto Elk Mountain Road. From Weaverville and points north take the exit ramp on the right, then left onto Elk Mountain Road. Then turn left (about .2 miles) onto Brookdale Road. Brookdale Road becomes N. Woodfin Avenue.

As soon as you cross the railroad tracks, pull into the parking area on the right.

If you prefer to unload first, then park...

WOODFIN RIVER PARK

From Asheville, take I-26 towards Weaverville. Take Exit 24 Elk Mountain Road. At the end of the ramp, turn left and go to the end of the road. Turn left – go approximately 1 mile and park is on the right.

From Weaverville and points north, take Interstate 26 towards Asheville. Take Exit 24 Elk Mountain Road. At the end of the ramp, turn right and go to the end of the road. Turn left – go approximately 1 mile and park is on the right.
